

- 2^{ly} To See if the Town will Accept of such Persons to Serve as Jurors, as are put into the Box for the Superior Court, also such Persons as are for the Inferior Court, & Court of Genl Sessions of the Peace, as put in the box by the Select men &c. As appears by a list herewith Exhibited.
 - 3^{ly} To See if the Town will by their Votes give leave that the Swine in S^d Town may go at large the Ensuing Year.
 - 4^{ly} To See whether the Town will by a Vote Order that the Old Pond in S^d Town be removed, and placed near the Center of S^d Town, or that they would Order a new Pond to be built on the Westely Side of Sudbury River, & placed near the Center of that part of the Town on the Westely Side &c. Agreeable to a petition of Josiah Browne Esq^r and Others.
 - 5^{ly} To See if the Town when met will by a Vote Accept the Several returns of the Persons who were appointed & ordered by the Select men, to perambulate, run & renew the Boundaries between this Town, & the adjacent Towns, and order the same to go on Record. And make due return of this Order with your Doings herein to the Select men of S^d Town at time & place above mentioned. Dated at Sudbury the fourth Day of May A.D. 1753.

Sudbury May 4th 1753. In Observance of the within written Order, I have warned all the freeholders, & other Inhabitants in my Ward qualified as the Law directs to Vote in Town Affairs to meet at time & place within mentioned. Jacob Moor, one of the Constables of Sudbury.

And the Return of the Other three Constables Orders were as the Law directs as may appear on file. — Sudbury May 4th 1753.

At a Town Meeting legally warned, the Town being met at time & place proceeded to the work of the Day, and chose M^r John Noyes jun^r their Representative.

- 2^{ly} At S^d Meeting the Town proceeded & chose M^r John Noyes jun^r Moderator. The Article as to Jurors was not acted upon, the Names of the Jurors being read over at March Meeting, & no Objection made against the Persons put into the Box by the Select men &c.
 - 3^{ly} It was put to Vote to See if the Swine in S^d Town shall go at large the Year Ensuing. And it passed in the Affirmative.
 - 4^{ly} It was put to Vote to See whether the Town will Order the Old Pond in S^d Town to be removed, and placed near the Center of S^d Town &c. or build a new Pond on the Westely Side of S^d Sudbury River &c. The whole passed in the Negative.
 - 5^{ly} The fifth Article was not acted upon, no Returns being brought & laid before the Town.
