Voted by S<sup>t</sup>. Town that they who have Overworked shall be carried to the  
Credit of the next year - And those that have not worked out their Rates  
have Liberty to work them out the next year.

9<sup>th</sup> S<sup>t</sup>. Town granted the further Sum of ————— £ 8 : 00 : 00  
for the Repairing the Meeting-Houses in S<sup>t</sup>. Town at present, &  
Ordered that the Select-men agree with some Suitable  
Persons to do the work.

11. Voted by S<sup>t</sup>. Town that all the Returns of those that perambulated  
the Lines, and renewed the Bound-Marks between the Town of Sudbury  
and the adjacent Towns, shall be put upon Record — — And then the  
Town adjourned S<sup>t</sup>. Meeting to Tuesday the Sixth Day of November next  
to the same place.

Sudbury Novemb<sup>r</sup>: 6<sup>th</sup> 1753.

The S<sup>t</sup>. Town met according to the S<sup>t</sup>. Adjournment, and proceeded to the work  
of the Day - And in further Answer to the Second Article in order for S<sup>t</sup>.  
Town Meeting: the S<sup>t</sup>. Town by a Vote made an Addition to the  
former grant of the S<sup>t</sup>. Town to y<sup>r</sup>. Rev. Ministers Gratuity, or  
Salary for the year ensuing; of the Sum of Eight Pounds thir-  
teen Shillings & four pence so as to make up the Sum of Seventy  
Pounds Lawfull Money to each of the S<sup>t</sup>. Ministers, which is in  
full for their Salary, Gratuity & firewood for the year ensuing.  
And they being present, declared themselves fully satisfied therewith  
at present. — And then the S<sup>t</sup>. Town by a Vote Ordered that  
the several Sums afores<sup>d</sup>. by them granted to the several Uses afores<sup>d</sup>.  
should be by the Town Clerk transmitted to the Assessors of y<sup>e</sup>. S<sup>t</sup>. Town  
as soon as may be, to be by them Assessed on the Inhabitants, of y<sup>e</sup>. Said  
Town in a just & Lawfull Manner for the several Uses afores<sup>d</sup>. And then  
the work of S<sup>t</sup>. Town meeting being finished the Meeting was dissolved.
