

- 4 To be if the town will By their votes accept of such persons to serve as Jurors as are put into the Box for the Superior Court also such persons as are for y<sup>e</sup> Inferiour Court & Generall Sessions of the Peace as put into the Box By the Selectmen & as appear By a list here with Exhibited
- 5 To be if y<sup>e</sup> town will By a votes accept of a Drift way (one Rod & a half wide) Laid out By the Selectmen of y<sup>e</sup> town through the Lands of Capt. Benold Seager to Allowance Meadow so called to Accomodate Cornelius Wood the Land Being formally Left By the Proprietors for that Use
- 6 To be if the town will mend make & Prepare their Highways By a vote the year ensuing as they did y<sup>e</sup> year past and Grant money for the same & the Surveyors to be Collectors &c
- 7 To be if the Town when met will Grant W<sup>m</sup> Rice the Sum of Six Pounds two Shillings & Eight pence Lawfull money Including what they Granted him at their meeting in October Last It being a Ballance Due to him Which he Laid When Treasurer for y<sup>e</sup> town over & above what was Committed to him As Treasurer for y<sup>e</sup> town as also Interest for what he over Paid and a further Sum for his service as Treasurer and order the town treasurer to Pay y<sup>e</sup> same agreeable to y<sup>e</sup> Petition of y<sup>e</sup> William
- 8 To be if the town will By a vote Lay a fine of two Shillings or more on any Person or persons that shall suffer his or their dog or Dogs to or about either of the meeting houses in y<sup>e</sup> town on the Lord or Sabbath day they make a Disturbance on y<sup>e</sup> Day or days for y<sup>e</sup> year ensuing y<sup>e</sup> fines to be Disposed of By the Selectmen for y<sup>e</sup> Use of the Poore of y<sup>e</sup> town or any other Meehod if y<sup>e</sup> town shall think fitt when met and make due Return of this order with your Doings here in to y<sup>e</sup> Selectmen or town Clerk at time & Place above Mentioned Dated at Sudbury February the 18. 1754
