

To Mr. Joseph Smith one of the Constables of Sudbury. Greeting: These are to offer you to warn all the free holders and other inhabitants of and belonging to Sudbury in your own Qualities as the Law Directs to vote in Town affairs. To meet at the Post meeting house in Sudbury on Monday the third day of March next at Ten of the Clock fore noon: 1. To Chose Selectmen. Town Clerk. Assessors. Town Treasurer. Constables and all other Town officers which the Law Requires to annually to be Chosen in the month of March.

2. To see if the Town will Grant to the several parsons here after named to them their heirs and assigns for ever the several pieces of Land in the thirty Rod Highways located in the new Grant as they have a Grant with the Towns Committee (Viz) Ephraim Curtis Thomas Damon and Jonathan Smith and order the Town Treasurer Mr. Samuel Parris or his Successor to Receive of Bonds or money for the Use of the Town of Sudbury which is Given for the purchase of said pieces of Land. To see if the Town will Pass a vote to Defend a Towns title to each of them if any parson or parsons shall dispute it in the Law. If reasonable application be made to the Town or to their Committee and by a vote of said Town Give order that the several Grants shall be made at the Purchasers Cost as Described in the several plans of the same. But if they neglect to make application as afore said But Chose to Carry on the Law sute or sute them selves the Town to be freed from a new Charge about said Law sute or sutes.

3. To all so to settle accounts with the said Committee (Viz) Ephraim Curtis Thomas Damon & Jonathan Smith 3 63-18-4
 and pay them what is due to them for their time and money Expended in the several Law sutes & the receiving Land for Sale &c. and Dismiss them or either of them from that service as they shall see cause and appoint others in their Room as fully Impower them or the major part of them to Proceede that affair either in the Law or by selling of Land as the Town Gave to the afore said Committee and to Grant money for their Committee to Carry on that affair to Effect in Law

4. To see if the Town will by a vote Discontinue a high way from Capt. Damons to Notick Line. and give the Land to Capt. Damon who Gave it to the Town in time past.

5. To see if the Town will accept of the List of Jurors as they are put in to the Box by the selectmen. And make Due Return of this order and your Doings there in to the selectmen or Town Clerk at time and place above mentioned: Sudbury february 20 1755
