Conclude on something to sende to Mr James Shearman
In answer to his Requests Made to the Church and Towne
Which Committe was

That Thomas Brown Esq^r Deacon names Mr Joseph Noyes
That John Goddard Esq^r leston Edward Light Mr Honoria Pitt
That John Crowt Esq^r Josiah Leveson Daniel Ston Sam^r

At a select meeting March 23rd: the select men
Agreed with Benjamin Parmenter to give
The mitting house from April the first 1626 to
April first 1627 for ten bushells of Indian Corn
or 20 shillons in Money. Which the Towne please
to do

And also Gooddy townsmen declared to the select men
that Benjamin Parmenter to the full agreement made by
the select men hath payed her for a heifer he bought of her

At a generall Town meeting May 22: 1626 Mr
Joseph Noyes^{sr} is Chosen a Deaconsentine for the year 1626
The Towne then agreed to him for seven pound for his service
Done at Court in a: 1625 also John Long is Chosen a wright
Grolemaster to teach Children to wright and cast accounts

allowed to follow it to any other person
