 the date heard of Sufficiently yoked to with the bridg or y^e under y^e
 to be as long as the Swin is high and the rooth that goeth
 about his neck to be 5 or six inches below the bridg and every
 Individuall Swin that shall be found wanting of yoke or wing
 shall pay six pence ap^rer for yoke or for wing so long as they
 are with out provided the forfeit^r may be taken but not more
 four and twenty how^r by ord^r of y^e select men In goodenow
