The Mon^r hath given to y^e poor of over Towne namely Mills Commonly call
by y^e name of y^e non Mills with y^e lands and priviledges belonging y^e same
the new and being feasible that y^e leasing of it yearly will be a means to y^e same
mills and howeing to decaye and in time utter Ruine which will be a
great wrong to our poor and that will not answer y^e end of y^e Towne
Therfor in respect to both and our own good which is involved in y^e same
we therfor by a vote grant liberty to them that are concerned as to y^e
disposall of y^e gift to dispose of it for years as they shall see cause
for y^e benefit and behoofe of y^e poor of our Towne
