To the Constables of Sudbury to warrant out of town Jacob Dunfin
And Abraham Holman The Returns from the Constables

By Vertue of A Warrant bearing date Aprill the 18: 1701 I have
Warned Jacob Dunfin to depart out of town of Sudbury within
fourteen dayes as the Law directs: Sudbury April the 18: 1701 Constable
Richard More

Also by Vertue of A Warrant bearing date April the 15: 1701 I have
Warned Abraham Holman to depart out of the town of Sudbury
Within fourteen dayes as the Law directs payth 26 Sudbury April 18: 1701
John Piro Constable

Also April the 20th 1701 Selectmen Examined Mr James Shoarmans out
Pates and have taken a true Copie of all the delinquents thearden
May 12th 1701

At a Generall Town Meeting the town voted and Chose men
who are as followeth James Barnard Senr Joseph Olason to treat
with Concord about a highway betwoun town and town where it
May be most Convenient for Each town to ly

Also at a Selectmens Meeting May 22: 1701 was made the towns Rate it being
18 pounds to pay the town dots abough written for the years 1700 and Comitted
To the Justiced Constables Mr John Piro and Mr Richard More to gather in
And to deliver it in to the towns Treasurer Deacon Peter King

Also at a town meeting lawfully warned and met to goether they then Chose
Mr William Brown to represent to serve at the generall Court hold May 28: 1701

Also at a selectmens Meeting July 23 was agreed to send for
Doctor Chatterk to agree with him and pay him for his wages abough
Debrah wodey June the 2: 1701

Also at a selectmens Meeting was impowred Mr Joseph Moyes
Senr James Barnard Senr Joseph Olason to lay out the highway betwoun
Concord and Sudbury and to make a Return under there handes as

August 5th Also at a selectmen meeting they agreed with Doctor Chatterk
And payed him for his wages and Doctor had gave to
Debrah wodey and agreed with him for a month to keep for
2 shilons a week which month will end September the 5: 1701

Also at a meeting of the Assessors September 2nd: 1701 was made
and finished the Kings tax amounting to 73 pound 3 shilons
and Comitted it to the Constables Mr John Piro Mr Richard More

Also at a Town Meeting lawfully warned September 24: 1701
the Selectmen impowred by the Town to make Mr Shoarmans
laste halfe years Rate which began March first 1701 ended
