house on the East side of the River should be set near Enoch Cleavelands house
this and those votes was past into acts by votes as attest John Brigham Moderator

Also it is agreed the same meeting and voted that the school houses shall be

Also at a select meeting January 20. 170² in Sudbury It was ordered agreed
and Concluded by the selectmen of the town above y^e that the rate

Sudbury at a meeting y^e 24 of February 1702 It is agreed and Concluded
that y^e town with and doth grant unto M^r Nath Pitcher Six pound per
Month in Cause hee doth Exert of the towns Schoor as to be our
Grammar Schoolmaster allso for on quarter of a year and to begin y^e this
of March next insuing and to serve in the place the full quarter
of a year on half of y^e time on the East side of the River
