

At a town Meeting March 6th 1702 It was ordered unto Monday the 23rd of March 1702 to Chuse all other officers the Law directs unto
 Also at a Solertmon Meeting they made M^r Shormans last half years Rate which was due March the first 1702 of 42 pounds 10 shillings

Also the above said Meeting the town voted that M^r James Shormans last half years Rate should be put into the Deacons hands to see that the Rate be gathered in and paid to M^r Shorman that he may his due
 Also at the above said Meeting the town voted and past into an act that the Solertmon should make a Rate of forty pounds or thereabouts to mender Kings highways

Received of M^r John Firo Constable of Sudbury ten pounds in full of a Warrant for thirty five pounds: For M^r James Taylor Treasurers

Also at a Town Meeting legally warned April 17th 1702
 The town voted and past into an act that if Schoolmaster should keep a School on the west side of the River at the house of Thomas Buttricks which is there parts of time belonging to the west side of the River

Also the above said Meeting Chose by a vote Thomas Futor to give the Meeting House and Ring the bell for forty Shillings in money
 the town
 the year began April 9th 1702 and the April 8th 1703

Also at a Solertmon Meeting May 11th 1702 they Chose to go upon proambulation for John Parmenter John Mores John Grout Joseph Mores John Abito East side west side of River James Lynes Peter Symton Garbariah Maynard & Samuel Rowson Samuel Row
