

4th Tho a forst meeting voted that the selectmen should

5th voted that the selectmen should see that if meeting house glass
should bee mended where it is wanting

Also at a selectmens meeting october 23: 1702 were made the County
Rate of six pounds two shillings by a warrant from Mr James Fuffel
Treasurer

Also the select men made Mr Shormans half years rate which
half began March first 1702 and ended ~~Sept~~ August last 1702 of 42
pounds 10 shillings

Also at a selectmen meeting November the 6th: 1702 they
Laid for sume part of our stock bullets and flints what was
wanting of our stock the above sd meeting November 6
And also the select men granted warrants to the Constables
to fetch in Mr Shormans out Arrows that were behind
also appointed the select men to one if west side of the River
to provide a place for to keep stock in this quarter
which began November 9th 1702

At a Town Meeting Legally warned January 12: 1703
The town voted and impowered the selectmen to make a Rate
of 20 pound six shillings to paye for the repairinge of the Meeting
house Glass: 12 pound of this 20 pound is in full for his ^{or naturall} service in being
our Schoolmaster from March the 3^d 1702 untill March 3^d: 1703 in June

The above sd meeting the town voted and Choos a Comittie to go and
view the high way in the new grants and to make a ~~to~~ ^{that} returne
to the town how they finde it the men are Choson are those
as followeth Mr William Brown Mr Thomas Smith John Lookfor Sen
