 - 8 eighthly all these particulars above mentioned by a vote of the town was past into an act this 11th of February 170⁴/₃ John Brigham Moderator

Also the town the above said year and day voted that the Committee for their direction should look back 3 years to what men paid to the ministers for their fuel and guide in the matter roads to be excepted

Also the above said day and year the town voted and granted to Lestonant Brown the 2 better seats at the north west door to sit upon in his relinquishing his other seats and joining it to his brothers row

Upon the Complaint of William Walker and Joseph Stanhoe Concerning A highway which they have now that they can pass with out great difficulty in the selectmen having been upon the spot seeking for a highway we heard the towns Community has made their return it should be at the west end of the grant that was formerly Joseph Curtises it was voted by the selectmen that they would state this highway a cross the above said grant 2 rods wide as now the same as may be with the least charge Also voted That Noah Clax and John Piro shall go and mark out said highway two rods wide according to the vote of the selectmen a cross said grant and Make return of your doing
