Sudbury may 25 1704 - The select men stated and marked out
a high way for William Walker Through y^e Land of John Gould
& John Moore: which is as followeth beginning at a stake
by a stump on y^e Easterly side of y^e 30 Rod highway y^e Runs
Through y^e now grants and from y^e stake to a maple marked
thence to a whit oak thence to a black oak thence to another
whit oak and last to a black oak upon y^e top of a hill there
marked here and in y^e land of John Goulding upon y^e Easterly
side of y^e high way: y^e marked trees in John Moores land
first a black oak and also marked black oaks upon y^e
Easterly side of y^e way till it comes to y^e 30 Rod highway
and also a high way of 12 Rod wide from y^e 30 Rod
high way to y^e about y^e high way of 4 Rod wide in y^e
land of John Moore running by y^e line of y^e between John
Goulding and John Moore: This about y^e high way of 4 Rod
wide westerly from y^e about y^e marked trees throu
out y^e land of y^e Goulding and Moore
In John Browns land first a black oak thence to another
black oak and then to a Red oak and so into y^e country Road
y^e leads from Sud to mat bury
