Town for the space of four Months next Ensuing the date of these Presents, after the Rate of twenty Six pounds - thirteen Shillings & four pence Lawfull Money p^r Annum Exclusive of his board which is five Shillings & four pence p^r Week of like money. - In witness whereof We have Interchangeably set our hands the Day & Year above written

Articles of agreement Made on y^e 2^d Day of December 1754 Between M^r W^m Cook junr. & the Selectmen of Sudbury in witness whereof M^r W^m Cook junr. hereby obligeth himself to keep a Grammar School in Sudbury three months from this Date at y^e Rate of twenty Six Pounds thirteen Shillings & four pence p^r year With four Shillings more p^r week for his Board & that y^e Selectmen do hereby oblige them selves in Behalf of y^e Town to see the M^r Cook Paid of y^e Sum W^m Cook junr.
