Sudbury October 27th. 1755.

At a Town meeting in Sudbury Leaguely warned the Town being met
at Time and Place proceeded and chose: Ebenezer Roby Esq^r Moderator
Then the Town proceeded to the work of the day &c

Granted to the Reverant Mr. Israel Loring including his salary Firewood } \$5-0-0
and Grattuity for the Ensueing year

Granted to the Reverant Mr. William Cook including his salary Firewood } 65-0-0
and Grattuity for the Ensueing year

Granted to John Ross for taking care of & sweeping the meeting House — 0-13-4
and for mails for said meeting House — 0-2-0
and for warning Two Town meetings — 0-4-0

Granted for the Support of the Grammar School for the Ensueing year — 30-0-0
Voted at said meeting by the Town to provide a Grammar Schoolmaster for
the Ensueing year

Voted that three fifths of the afore said money be for keeping on the west
side of the River in said Town: and to be kept at the four out school
houses &c
Voted that two fifths of the afore said money be for the East side of the
River: And to be kept at the school House by Mr. Smiths and as near to
Dea^r James Brewers as can be procured

Granted to Joseph Smith for part of John Cheney's Rates

To James Brewer Juner. for Obediah Moor Rates in the year 1754.

To David How Juner. for Eighty feet of Plank Laid on the bridge by Mr. Ross

To Elijah Bent for Josiah Woodward's Rates and for warning one Town meeting

To Cornelias Wood for warning Two Town meetings

To Elijah Smith for warning Two Town meetings

To Daniel Woodward for Two hundred & fifty feet of Plank

To John Rice for Samuel Rags, is Rates

To John Clapp for the Rates of Barthol. Sargent. alias Stevenson

To Isaac Read for one hundred & twelve feet of plank and for 168 feet of timber — 14

To Samuel Curtis, for warnings Seven Parsons out of Town and for warning } 11-12-
Two Town meetings

To Joseph Smith for warning march meeting — 0-2-
To Ephraim Curtis for a warrant. to warn Seven parsons out of Town — 0-1-

and allowed for three half Days spent in the new Grant affair being one
Parsons since settling a Compt with the Town six shillings & 6 pence
the interest money arising out of the Bond in the Town Treasury &c

The Town appointed Charon London to take care of & sweep the west meet
house for the Ensueing year & to have for his service Twelve shillings
and appointed the S^r. Charon London to dig Graves as there may be occa
The Town by a vote turned the meeting to Monday the Tenth
November next to meet at the same place at Ten of the clock fore noon
to finish the work set forth in the warning for said meeting
