

Sudbury February 17. 1756.

- To Mr Cornelius Wood one of the Constables of Sudbury Greeting.
- These are to order you to warn all the freeholders and other Inhabitants of and Belonging to Sudbury on the west side of the River in your ward qualified as the Law Directs to Vote in Town affairs To meet at the West Meeting House in said Town on Monday the first Day of March next at Ten of the Clock in the forenoon on said Day there and there to Elect and Chuse 1. selectmen. 2. Town Clerk 3. Town Treasurer. 4. Assessors. 5. Constables. 6. And all other Town officers as the Law Directs to be annually Chose in the month of March
7. To see if the Town will accept of such Parsons to serve as Jurors as are put into the Box to serve at the Superior Court. Also such Parsons as are for the Inferiour Court. and Court of Generall sessions of the peace as are put into the Box by the selectmen &c as appears by a List here with Exhibited
8. To see if the Town will by a Vote Give Liberty for Horses going at Large in any part of the Time from the first of April to the last of November the year ensuing with out Tethers
9. To see if the Town will vote that the sheep may go at Large in said Town any part of the Time Between the fifteenth Day of March next and the first Day of May next.
10. To see if the Town will accept of a Plan of about four acres & one hundred and forty Rod of Land Taken by Capt. David Haynes Surveyor December 27. 1745. Laid out for Mr. Samuel Willig Junior. For satisfaction for Land Taken from him for high ways &c And Give Liberty for his Plan to be recorded
11. To see if the Town will Give and Grant to Benjamin Ball to him his heirs and assigns for Ever as he has petitioned for where his Barn now stands with Convenience of a Cowyard not to straighten the Entry Road or any other highways &c
12. To see if the Town will petition the Generall Court for an act of assembly to Raise money by way of a Lottery to Enable them to Raise & Repair the Long Causeway from the Bridge to Lieut. Benjamin Estabrooks a greable to a Petition of Capt. Reynolds Seagar & others
- And make Return of this order to the selectmen or Town Clerk at time &c
