- To Mr Micah Bent one of the Constables of Sudbury - Greeting
- These are to Order you, to warn all the Freeholders & other Inhabitants of & belonging to Sudbury, in your Ward Qualified as the Law directs, to Vote in Town Affairs, and in the choice of Representatives to meet, at the East Meeting House in Sudbury on Friday the fourteenth Day of May Current at one of the Clock Afternoon
- To Elect & depute, one or more Person or Persons, being Freeholders and Resident in sd Town, to serve for, & Represent sd Town at a great & General Court to be conven'd, held & kept for his Majestys Service, at the Court House in Boston on Wednesday the twenty sixth Day of May Current, at nine o'Clock forenoon, and so to die in them during their Session and Sessions as directed in the precept sent to sd Town
- To see if the Town will petition the General Court for an Act of Assembly, to raise money by way of a Lottery to enable them to raise & repair the Long Causey, from the Bridge to Lieut Benjⁿ Eastherbrook, agreeable to a Petition of Cap^t Reynold Seager & others.
- To see if the Town will give Liberty, that the swine in sd Town go at Large the Year ensuing
- To see if the Town will Act any thing upon a petition relating to the settling of the Affairs concerning the New Grant which was in sd Town of Sudbury, agreeable to a Petition of John Cap & others, as may more fully appear by sd Petition, produced in Town meeting.
- To see if the Town will grant the Petition of Joseph Tower to pay Doctor Perkins for his Doctoring Edward Joyner & his Family in their sickness

And make return of this Order to the Selectmen, at time & place
