Sudbury Decm 10th 1756

We the Select Men of the Town of Sudbury have agreed with Mr John Monroe to keep the Grammar School in the Town of Sudbury for one Quarter of a Year for the Sum of Six pounds thirteen Shillings & four pence Also tis agreed that the sd School Master shall instruct the Children in Reading Writing & Arithmetick & the School to begin on Monday the thirteenth of this Instant Dec & the Town of Sudbury to pay for his Boarding As Witness our Hands Eben^r Roby Select

To Mr Asher Cutler one of the Constables of Sudbury Greeting
These are to Order you to warn all the Freeholders & other Inhabitants off & belonging to Sudbury in your Ward Qualified as the Law Directs to Vote in Town Affairs to meet at the next Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the Seventh Day of March Next at Nine of the Clock before Noon & there to Choose Select Men Town Clerk Town Treasurer Assessors Constables and all other Town Officers as the Law directs Annually to be Chosen in the Month of March.

2^d To see if the Town will by a Vote give Liberty for Horses going at large in any part of the Time from the first of April to the last of November the Year ensuing without fetters

3^d To see if the Town will Vote that the Sheep may go at large in any part of the Time from the fifteenth Day of March Next to the first Day of May Next

4th To see if the Town will appropriate so much money out of what was Granted to finish repairing the Meeting Houses & will pay their Assessors for their Service the Year past

5th To see if the Town will Sell to Mr Isaac Cutting about twenty rods of Land being formerly a part of a County Road leading from Mr Josiah Livermores to Framingham & since discontinued & Land adjoining to the Ministerial Land

And make return of this Order to the Town Clerk at least two Days before the aforesaid Meeting by Order of the Select Men
