2^d article relating to Horses going at large without hettors, was put to Vote and pass'd in the Negative

3^d article relating to Sheep going at large was put to Vote & pass'd in the Negative

4th The Town by their Vote appropriated so much money out of what was granted to repair the Meeting Houses as would pay their Apepors for their service the year past

5th The Town by their Vote Sold Mr Isaac Cutting for twelve shillings, so much land upon the North side of the County Road, opposite to Said Cuttings Wall, as to make the County Road three rods wide, against Said Cuttings Wall, it was also voted by the Town, that said Cutting should indemnifie the Town from any charge that might ever any ways arise about Said Land, which Said Cutting promised to do.
