To Mr Joseph Willis one of the Constables of Sudbury - Greeting
These are to Order you to Warn, all the Freeholders & other Inhabitants
off & belonging to Sudbury, in your Ward, Qualify^d as the Law direct
to Vote in Town Affairs, to meet at the Last Meeting House, in
Sudbury, on Tuesday the twenty fifth Day of October current
at twelve o'clock at Noon, then & there

1st To bring in Town debts & Credit

2^d To see if the Town will Grant their Rev^d Ministers, an Honoura-
ble Gratuity, for the Year ensuing, including their Salary and
Firewood.

3^d To see if the Town will provide a Grammar School-Master, and
Order where the School shall be kept, the ensuing Year, and Grant
money, for the Support of the same

4th To see if the Town will grant Money, for the support of the Read-
ing & Writing Schools, and Order where Said Schools shall be kept
the ensuing Year.

5th To see if the Town will Appoint a Man or Men, to take Care off &
Sweep, each of the Meeting Houses, in Said Town, the Year ensuing
and dig Graves as there may be occasion

6th To see if the Town will grant Money, for the relief of the Poor
in Said, the Year ensuing

7th To see if the Town will take an effectual method, to prevent Cut-
ting Wood or Timber, on the thirty Rod High Ways, so called, in said
Town, or removing Bound Marks &c Also to see if the Town will
Run the Lines & Renew the Bound Marks, between the thirty Rod
High Ways, in S^d Town, & the Lots adjoyning thereto, Agreeable to
a Petition of Capt Segers & others.

8th To see if the Town will Sell to Daniel Bouker, a Slip of Land of
two Rods wide, lying between Thomas Brigham's Land & Joseph May-
nard's - - Or let Joseph Maynard have it, in Satisfaction for a High
Way laid through his Land, if it should appear to be just.

9th To see if the Town will settle Accounts, with their Committee, viz: John
Curtis Esq: Cap: Tho: Damon & Mr Jonathan Smith, And Grant a sufficient
sum of money, to enable them, to proceed in the Affairs, of the thirty
Rod High Way, to final issue in the Law
