Acre & ordered the plan to be Recorded.
The Town by their Vote Granted the sum of five pound to pay their
Assessors & Town Treasurer.

And the Town by their Vote Ordered that, the Execution

To Mr Thomas Hayden one of the Constables of Sudbury... Greeting
These are to Order you, to Warn, All the Freeholders & other Inhabitants
off & belonging to Sudbury, in your Ward, Qualified as the Law direct
to Vote in Town Affairs, to meet at the West Meeting House in Sudbury
on Monday the Sixth Day of March Next at ten o Clock before
Nine, Men & three, 1st To Choose Select Men, Town Clerk, Town Treas-
urer, Assessors, Constables and all other Town Officers, as the Law
directs, Annually to be Chosen in the Month of March

To See if the Town will by a Vote give liberty for Horses, going at
large without Fetters, any part of the time, from the first of April
to the last of November, The Year ensuing

To See if the Town will by a Vote, give liberty for the Sheep in Said
Town, to go at large, any part of the time, from the fifteenth Day
of March Next to the first Day of May Next.

To See if the Town of Sudbury, will repair the long Causeway in Said
Town, from the Town Bridge to Mr Carters - Also the Short Causeways
toward Quot Notabrooks by way of Lottery, and choose three Men
as Agents & empower any two of them, to Apply to the General Court
in the Name & behalf of the Town of Sudbury, for an Act of the As-
sembly, to enable the Town, by way of Lottery, to raise a Sufficient
sum of money, to finish & compleat sd Work, the sd Persons Chosen
and that next of sd trust, are to promise in Case of failure in obtain-
ing an Act for sd Lottery, not to charge the Town, one penny for
their trouble, Agreeable to a Petition of Josiah Browne Esq^r & others
To See if the Town will Grant liberty to Maj^r Rogers & William Elisk
to sett up two Gates, with fences across the Road, the one at Whales
(called) & the other at the Entring of the Town Road Leading from
the said Whales to the Meeting House Agreeable to a Petition of Ephraim
