2^d the 2^d Article relating to Horses going at large without Tethers was
put to Vote & pass'd in the Negative.

3^d the 3^d Article was put to Vote & pass'd in the Negative

4th The Question was put whether the Town thought it necessary to repair
the long Causeway & short ones & it pass'd in the Affirmative

Then the Question was put whether they would do it by way of Lottery &
it pass'd in the Affirmative. and the Town chose the following

Persons to act as Agents in Petitioning the General Assembly for a
Lottery to enable the Town of Sudbury to raise & repair the long
Causeway, & the two short ones towards Lieut Rotabrooks viz^t Col: John
Noyes Mr William Baldwin & Col: Josiah Braine

5th The Town by their Vote gave leave to Col: Noyes & Mr Samuel Smith
to make a fence & hang gates agreeable to the 5th Article during the
Town's Pleasure

6th The Town Voted that they would repair their High Ways the present
Year & granted the Sum of Sixty pounds to repair their High Ways
the ensuing Year & the Town Ordered their Apesons to make it into
a rate forthwith

7th The Town accepted of the High Way laid out by their Select Men through
Mr Elisha Wheelers Land, from Elias Moores to the West Meeting House
and the Town by their Vote gave leave to Mr Elisha Wheeler to hang
a gate at the South End of the Way during the Town's Pleasure

8th The Town accepted of Mr Samuel Osborns Plan of Sixteen Acres of
Land (exclusive of Lancaster Road running through it) sold him by
the Towns Committee, in the thirty Rod High Way & ordered it to
be Recorded.

9th The 10th Article Pass'd in the Negative

Then Agreed with Mr Eliab Stone to keep a Grammar School
in D. Town, for the Space of three Months, And to instruct Children
in Reading Writing & Cyphering, And to keep after the Rate of
twenty Six pounds, Thirteen Shillings & four pence p^r Year. & four
Shillings p^r Week for Board
