

- * To Mr Josiah Bennett one of the Constables of Sudbury. Greeting
 These are to Order you, to Warn, all the Freeholders & other Inhabitants
 off and belonging to Sudbury, in your Ward Qualified as the
 Law directs, to Vote in Town Affairs, and in the choice of Represen-
 tatives, to Meet at the East Meeting House in Sudbury on Wednes-
 day the seventeenth Day of May Curr: at two o'clock After Noon
 To Elect & depute one or more Person or Persons being Freeholders and
 Resident in said Town, to Serve for & Represent said Town at a Great
 and General Court, to be convened held & kept for his Majesty's Service
 at the Court House in Boston, on Wednesday the thirtieth first Day of
 May Curr: at Nine o'clock A.M. and so to do &c. in due time During the
 Session & Sessions as directed in the Precept sent to said Town
- 2^d To See if the Town will give Liberty, that the wine may go at
 large in said Town the Year ensuing
- 3^d To see if the Town will Grant to the Several Persons hereafter
 Named, to them their Heirs & Assigns forever, the Several pieces
 of Land, in the thirty Rod High Ways (so called) in the New Grant,
 As they have agreed with the Towns Committee for, viz: Ephraim
 Curtis Thomas Damon & Jonathan Smith - And Order the Town Treasur-
 Mr Samuel Harris or his Successor, to Receive the Bonds or Money
 for the Use of the Town of Sudbury, which is given for the purchase
 of said pieces of Land. - To see if the Town will pass a Vote to de-
 fend the Towns Title to each of them. if any Person or Persons shall
 dispute it in the Law, if Seasonable Application be made to the
 Town, or to their Committee, and by a Vote of said Town give Order
 that the Several Grants shall be Recorded, at the purchasers cost - As
 described in the Several Plans of the same - but if they neglect to
 make Seasonable Application as aforesaid - but choose to carry on the
 Law Suit or Suits themselves the Town to be freed from any Charge
 about said Law Suit or Suits.
- To John Brigham about four Acres in the East thirty Rod Way near
 his House at one pound eight Shillings per Acre Lawful Money
- To Samuel Knight about ten or twelve Acres, in the West thirty Rod
 Way, in the New Grant, of upland & swamp near his House at three

 Shillings per Acre on both Sides the Country Road
- To Jonathan Stanhope about 20 Acres in the West 30 Rod Way at one
 pound one Shilling & four pence per Acre
- To Mr Ezekiel How about 3 Acres in the West 30 Rod Way near his House
 at twenty eight Shillings per Acre
- To Deliverance Parminter about two Acres & half & 20 Rods at twenty eight
 Shillings per Acre in the West 30 Rod Way
