

- 10th The Town by their Vote Ordered their Town Treasurer Mr Sam^l Parris to call in the interest money due on the Bonds - taken for Land, sold in the thirty Rod New Grant High Way - Also the Town Voted that the Select-Men should draw so much of the Interest money, for the support of the Poor, as they shall find necessary, for the present year & the Select Mens Order shall discharge the s^d Treasurer for so much as they draw out Also to provide Teaching as there shall be occasion
- 11th The Town by their Vote Granted & Confirmed to Mr Obadiah Perry his plan of three Acres & Ninety Rods of Land, partly for Satisfaction for Land taken from him, agreeable to the Article & partly for money paid by S^d Perry viz six Shillings Lawful money
- 12th The Town by their Vote granted to Mr John Ross the sum of one pound ten Shillings & Eight pence for procuring plank for the Town Bridge
- 13th It was put to Vote, whether the Town would settle ^{accounts} with their Committee & pay them for their time spent in viewing & appraising Land for Sale in the New Grant High Ways & it was, in the Affirmative And the Town by their Vote Allowed the following Accounts - Also Allowed them for their Extraordinary Time spent in that affair...

There are to Order you to Warn all the Freeholders, & other Inhabitants off & Belonging to Sudbury, in your Ward, Qualified as the Law directs, to Vote in Town Affairs, to meet at the East Meeting House in Sudbury, on Monday the fifth Day of March next at ten o'Clock before Noon then & there

1st To choose Select Men, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer Assessors Constables And all other Town Officers, as the Law directs Annually to be Chosen in the Month of March.

2^d To see if the Town by their Vote will give Liberty for Horses to go at large, without fetters any part of the Time from the first of April to the last of November the Year ensuing
