

- 3^{dly} To see if the Town will, by a Vote, give Liberty for the Sheep in in D. Town, to go at large, any part of the Time, from the fifteenth Day of March Next, to the first Day of May Next.
- 4th To see if the Town will choose some Person to take care off & Sweep the East Meeting House in D. Town, and to dig Graves as there may be occasion.
- 5th Also to see if the Town will choose overseers, for the Poor in D. Town.
- 6th To see if the Town will give & Grant to the Heirs of Benjamin Wight & to their Heirs & assigns the thirty Rod High Way Lying Between the Lott, that was D. Wights & the Lott that was Benjamin Moore, in full Satisfaction for Lancaster Road through the D. Lott that was the D. Wights as sett forth in the Petition of the D. Wights Heirs.
- 7th To see if the Town By their Vote will choose a Man or Men to to Appear at the Next Sessions to answer to a Report of a Committee, in Laying out a Road from Concord to Marlborough through the New Grants in D. Town (so called) or by any other Way in D. Affair as the Town shall think proper when met. — Also to Grant a Suitable sum of money for carrying on D. Affair as the Town shall think proper &c.
- 8th To see if the Town, by their Vote will give leave to Cap^t Moses Brewer to Build a pue, over the Womens Stairs in the East Meeting House in D. Town & to Cutt a Window for the Convenience of the Same, so as not to discommode any Person & to do it at his own Cost Agreeable to the Request of D. Brewer.
- 9th To see if the Town, will by their Vote give Leave to Samuel Dahin Sam^l Puffer Asahel Wheeler Charles Haynes & James Puffer to Build a pue over the Mens Stairs in the West Meeting House in D. Town Agreeable to their Petition &c.
- 10th To see if the Town will Repair their High Ways by a Rate the present Year & grant a Suitable sum of Money for Repairing the Same. — And impower the Surveyors to be Collectors of said Rate — And also Order the Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith.

And make due Return of this Order with your doings therein unto the Town Clerk of D. Town, at least two Days before the aforesaid Meeting. By Order of the Select Men
