to Vote in Town Affairs; to Meet at the West Meeting House in Sudbury
on Monday the third Day of March Next at ten o' Clock before
Noon - Then & there

1st To Choose Select-Men, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Assessors, Constables
And all other Town Officers, As the Law Directs Annually to be Chosen
in the Month of March

2^d To See if the Town by their Vote, will give liberty for Horses to go
at large, without letters, any part of the time from the first of April
to the last of November the Year ensuing

3^d To See if the Town, by a Vote, will give liberty for the Sheep to go
at large, in S. D. Town, Any part of the time from the fifteenth Day of
March Next, to the first Day of May Next.

4th To See if the Town will Repair their High Ways, by a Rate the
present Year - And grant a Suitable Sum of money for Repairing
the same - And empower the Surveyors to be Collectors of S. D. Rate
Also Order the Assessor to make it into a Rate forthwith.

5th To See if the Town will Accept of the Way as it is laid out by the
Select-Men of Sudbury, Leading from Moses Rices over the New Bridge
into the Way that leads from Mr Shermans to Mr Sam^l Abbot
Also Another Way leading from Mr Sam^l Abbot to Lincoln Bounds
by Spruce Swamp (so called) at the Request of Mr Sherman & others
