Sold in the New Grant High Ways for the Relief of the Poor in
S. Town

5th The Town by their Vote Accepted of the List of Jurors and Se.
lected out one Quarter part of S. List to serve as Jurors at the
Superiour Court - Agreeable to a late Act of the General Assembly

6th The Town by their Vote discontinued the Way lying between
22 the Lands of Mr Joseph Maynard & the Land formerly Mr John
Brighams and empower'd Mr John Balcom to dispose of Same

7th The Town by their Vote Ordered the two Precinct Books to be
delivered to the Town Clerk, to be kept with the other Town
Books
