off and belonging to Sudbury, in your Ward, Qualified as the
Law Directs to Vote in Town Affairs to meet at the Last Meet-
ing House in Sudbury on Monday the twenty Sixth Day of
Jan^y Inst at twelve o' Clock at Noon - Then & there

1st To know the Minds of the Town, whether inasmuch as by
the Providence of God the Rev^d M^r Cook is Removed by
Death and the Last Precinct in s^d Town is thereby destitute
of a Minister &c: To know whether the Town will be at
the charge of Settling a Minister in s^d Precinct and pay
him his Salary by a Tax as Usual - or Act in any other
way, manner in s^d Affair as the Town shall think proper
when met

2^d To see if the Town by their Vote, will take all the Tickets
in Sudbury Lottery Third Class, that shall Remain unsold
in the Managers hands, when the drawing s^d Lottery shall
Commence; agreeable to s^d Lottery Act, And Order the Town
Treasurer or Some Suitable Person to Receive the Tickets that
Remain as afores^d

And make due Return of this Order with your doings thereon
at time & place abovementioned to the Select Men of s^d Town

At a Meeting of the Town of Sudbury Legally Warned Jan^y 26th
1761 the Town being met at time & place proceeded & chose Col:
John Noyes Mod^r - Then the Town proceeded &c
1st The Town by their Vote dismissed the first Article Relating
to the Settling of a Minister

2^d The Town by their Vote - Voted to take all the Tickets in
Sudbury Lottery Third Class, that shall Remain unsold in the
Managers Hands when the drawing s^d Lottery shall commence
agreeable to s^d Article - And Ordered the Tickets that remain un-
sold as afores^d to be lodged with the Town Treasurer on the Day
the Lottery Commences drawing
