

- 2<sup>d</sup> Article was put to Vote and passed in the Negative
- 3<sup>d</sup> The Town Voted to Repair their High Way by a Rate the present Year And Granted Sixty pounds to Repair the Same and Impowered the Surveyors to be Collectors of <sup>S<sup>d</sup></sup> Rate Also Ordered the Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith . . . . .
- 4<sup>th</sup> Article was put to Vote and passed in the Negative
- 5<sup>th</sup> The Town by their Vote accepted of the Road as it was laid out by the Select. Men Leading from Mr Josiah Tarnars to Lincoln Line and Ordered the Same to be Recorded
- 6<sup>th</sup> Article was put to Vote and passed in the Negative
- 7<sup>th</sup> The Town by their Vote Accepted and confirmed the Report of their Committee - viz<sup>t</sup> Maj<sup>r</sup> Jo<sup>s</sup> Curtis Mr Ezra Graves & Eliza Wheeler and Ordered it to be Recorded
- 8<sup>th</sup> The Town by their Vote - let to Mr Isaac Read that piece of Land which was formerly improved by Mr Josiah Pratt for the Space of ten years for twenty one Shillings & four pence p<sup>r</sup> year to be paid yearly - And the S<sup>d</sup> Read at the Expiration of S<sup>d</sup> Term is to leave twenty Rods of good Stone Wall standing on S<sup>d</sup> Land and enclosed with a sufficient Fence equal to a four Rail Fence
- 9 The Town by their Vote - Consented that Eliza Jones and Mr Robert Jenison and their Lands adjoining to Sudbury might be laid to the Town of Sudbury Agreeable to their Petition

These Order you to Warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants off and belonging to Sudbury, on the East Side of the River, Qualified by the Law Directs to Vote in Town Affairs and in the choice of Representatives to meet at the West Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the Eleventh Day of May Next at two o'Clock Afternoon

1<sup>st</sup> To Elect and depute one or more Person or Persons being Freeholders and Resident in S<sup>d</sup> Town; to Serve for and Represent said Town at a Great and General Court or Assembly, appointed to be convened and kept for his Majesties Service at the Court House in Boston, on Wednesday the twenty Seventh Day of May Next at Nine o'Clock A. M.

2<sup>d</sup> And so to die in Duem during their Session or Sessions, As directed in the precept Sent to S<sup>d</sup> Town

2<sup>d</sup> To see if the Town will give Liberty, for the Swine to go at large

3<sup>d</sup> To see if the Town by their Vote will discontinue four Rods in Width of the Town Way Leading Through Mr James Haynes Land to Daniel Bowlers so far as it runs in S<sup>d</sup> Haynes Land And chuse a Comm<sup>tee</sup> to dispose of the Same
