Serve as Constable this present Year in the Room of Tho^s Brintnall
5th To See if the Town will appropriate so much of the money Granted
for the New Mr Cooks Salary in Octobr 1760 as shall be thought
proper to defray the Charges of the New Mr Cooks Salary
6th To See what method the Town will take to Raise the money
to pay for the Tickets which the Town Voted to take
And make due Return of this Order with your doings thereon unto
the Town Clerk, at least one Day before the Next Meeting
By Order of the Select Men Wm Baldwin Town Clerk
Sudbury April 29th 1761

The Return of the other two Constables Orders were as the Law
Directs and were Accepted by the Town

At a Meeting of the Town of Sudbury Legally Warned May 11th 1761
The Town being met at time and place proceeded and chose for their
Representative, the ensuing Year, Col. John Noyes - a Freeholder and
Resident in sd Town

At sd Meeting May 11th 1761 The Town proceeded and chose Col. John
Noyes Moderator

The 2^d Article was put to Vote and passed in the affirmative

3^d Article was put to Vote and passed in the Negative

4th The Town by their Vote Accepted of Phineas Brintnall to Serve as
Constable in the Room of his Son Tho^s Brintnall who was chose
in March 1761

5th The Town by their Vote appropriated the Sum of Seventeen pound
Six Shillings and Eight pence out of the money Granted for
the New Mr Wm Cooks Salary in the Year 1760 to defray the New
Mr Wm Cooks funeral Charges

6th The Town by their Vote granted twenty Seven pounds twelve
Shillings Lawfull Money, to defray the Exp^s the Town Sustained
by the Tickets, which the Town Voted to take, and Ordered the
Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith - and each Person to
have the Liberty. to Work out his Rate - provided he or they
work it out at or before the time Sett for Working out sd
Rate - and to be under the Regulation of the Managers of sd
Lottery
