Generall Court on Thursday Next to shew their Reasons why the pray-
er of a Petition of Bel^l Adams Stone and others Relating to the Settle-
ment of a Gospel Minister on the East Side of the River in S^d
Town shall not be Granted, wherein S^d Petitioner request that
that they may be Enabled to settle a Gospel Minister at the
Cost and Charge of the Town - Or to do and Act any other way
as the Town shall think proper when Met - And Make Return
of your Doings thereon to the Select Men at time and place

At a Town Meeting in Sudbury Legally Warned June 30th 1761
the Town being met at time and place proceeded and chose Col.
John Noyes Mod^r: &c^a

It was put to Vote to see if the Town would chose an Agent or
Agents to appear at the Gen^l: Court &c^a and it pass'd in the Negative
and the Town by their Vote consented that the Prayer of the Petition
now in Court should be Granted - Provided the Court would Grant and
confirm the like Priviledge to the west Church and Congregation
