- 8th The Town Voted to Hire some suitable House for a Work House that the Idle Persons in S.d Town might be kept to Labour
- 9th The Town, by their Vote, Accepted of the Report of the Select-Men & Granted and confirmed the same to Mr James Haynes, all the High Way leading by his House, from the Lands in Possession of the Heirs of Joshua Haynes Deceased to the Brook running across s.d Way Southerly of D. Haynes's House Excepting two Rods for a High Way
