

- 4th To see if the Town will Grant money for the Support of the Reading and Writing schools, and Order where the Schools shall be kept the ensuing Year --
- 5th To see if the Town will appoint a Man or Men to take Care off and sweep each of the Meeting Houses in s.d Town the Year ensu
- 6th and to dig Graves as there may be Occasion --
- 6th To See if the Town will Grant money for the Relief of the Poor in s.d Town, the Year ensuing
- 7th To See if the Town will Grant money to pay their Assessors the present Year
- 8th To See if the Town will Vote and Order that the Managers of Sudbury Lottery, shall take their pay for their attendance on said Lottery or Lotteries, out of the money arising by Sale of said Lottery Tickets and those forfeited. - Or Vote and Order a sum of money sufficient to pay s.d Managers for their attendance on said Lotteries
- 9th To See if the Town will appoint a proper Person to Ring and Toll the Bell at the West Meeting House in Sudbury, Agreeable to a petition of Cap^t Rey^d: Seager and others
- 10th To See if the Town will Grant and confirm to Obadiah Perry, a piece of Land in the Thirty Rod wide High Way (so called) and Order the Plan of s.d Land to be Recorded, s.d Perry giving the Town proper security for the same
- 11th To See if the Town will allow to Constable Thinchas Pwintnall what Mr James Graves and Mr Joseph Goodenow were Rated for their Sons Polls in the Year 1761 --
- 12th To See if the Town will Grant and confirm to Joseph Willis seven Acres and one Hundred and forty Rods of Land, lying in the Thirty Rod wide High Way (so called) and Order his plan of s.d Land to be Recorded he giving the Town proper Security for the same
- 13th To See if the Town will choose a Comm^{tee} and fully empower them to examine into the Accounts - so as to know how the Grants made by the Town, for the Support of the Poor, for several Years past, have been disposed off, Agreeable to a Petition of Ebenezer Moby Rog^r & others
- 14th To See if the Town will make Satisfaction to Mr John Balcom for Land taken from him for a High Way
- 15th To See if the Town will discontinue the old Road leading thro^o Cap^t David Baldwin's Land, near the Town Bridge, to sedge meadow (so called) And accept of the other Road as it is laid out by the Select Men Provided s.d Baldwin will Oblige himself and his Heirs to erect a proper Fence Neat the River. so far as the Water is deep, to prevent Teams Running into the River
- 16th To See if the Town will purchase, the Several pieces of Land, which Col: Josiah Brown gave for the Benefit of the West Church in s.d Town to lye for the Benefit of settling a Minister or Ministers in s.d Land to
