Voted forty pounds for the Support of the Same 40 - -
- 3^d The Town by their Vote Granted Seventy four pounds to each of 148 - -
their Recd Ministers for their Salary the Year ensuing
- 4th The Town by their Vote Granted twenty pounds for the Support
of the Reading and Writing Schools, and also Ordered that the 20 - -
Schools should be kept in the Same places the ensuing Year
that they were the last Year
- 5th The Town by their Vote appointed Mr Aaron Johnson to take care off and
Sweep the West Meeting House and also to digg Graves as there may be
Occasion
- The Town by their Vote appointed Mr Benj. Ball to do the like Service
on the East Side
- 6th The Town by their Vote. Granted for the Relief of the Poor - 50 - -
the present Year fifty pounds
- 7th The Town by their Vote Granted five pounds, to pay their Apsons
the present Year, provided the Apsons exhibit an Account of their
Charge to the Town at one of their Annual Meetings 5 - -
