- 13th The Town by their Vote - Voted to choose a Committee to examine into the Grants made by the Town of Sudbury, for the Support of the Poor so far back as the Settlement which was made with Mr Wm^r Wm^rie, so as to know how the money has been disposed off, and by Vote chose Cap^t Key^s Seager Eben^r Proby Esq^r & Cap^t David Baldwin a Committee to examine into the above affair and impowered them to demand any Copy or Copies of the Town Grants or papers Relative thereto - and to make return to the Town, at one of their Annual Meetings
- 14th The Town by their Vote - Voted that the Select. Men should make Satisfaction to Mr John Balem (for a Road near his House) out of the thirty Rod wide High Way Near Philip Nailys Dwelling House

These Order you to warn all the Freeholders and Other Inhabitants of and belonging to Sudbury (in your ward) Qualified as the Law Directs to Vote in Town affairs to meet at the East meetinghouse in Sudbury On Monday the Seventh Day of March next at Ten o'clock before Noone then and there -

- 1st To Choose Selectmen Town Clerk Town Treasurer Assessors Constables and all other Town Officers which the Law Directs to be Annually Chosen in the month of March.
- 2^d To See if the Town by their Vote will Give Liberty for Horses to go at Large (without Tether) any part of the time from the first of April to the Last of November the year ensuing
- 3^d To See if the Town will Repair their Highways by a Rate the present year and Grant a Suitable Sum of money for Repairing the same and Impower the Surveyors to be Collectors of Said Rate also Order the Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith
