

4th To See if the Town by their Vote will Give Liberty for Sheep to Go at Large in ^{Sd} Town any part of the time from the fifteenth Day of March Next to the first Day of May Next

5th To See if the Town will Discontinue the Old Road leading thro^t Capt David Baldwins Land near the Town Bridge to Sedge Meadow (so called) and Except of the other Road as it is Laid out by the Selectmen, provided said Baldwin will Oblige himself, and his Heirs forever to Erect a proper Fence Next the River so far as the water is Deep to prevent Teams Running into the River -

6th To See if the Town will Discontinue the Town Road leading East from Concord Road to Lincoln line and Except of the Road as it is marked and laid out by the Selectmen -

7th To See if the Town will Choose a Committee to Build a work house in the Town that the Idle persons in ^{Sd} Town might be kept to hard Labour, and Grant or appropriate a suitable sum of money out of the New Grant Bond in the Town Treasurers Hand to Build the same, also Order where ^{Sd} House shall be Built, and Do or act any other way in ^{Sd} affair as the Town shall think proper when met -

8th To See if the Town will accept of a plan of Lev^t Joseph Willis Land in the East 30 Rod wide Highway of three acres and forty four Rods and Order the same to be Recorded it being in full Satisfaction for a Road thro^t the land of ^{Sd} Willis and thro^t the Land of Mr. John Balcom -

9th To See if the Town will Grant and Confirm to Obadiah Perry and his Heirs forever a Tract of Land of thirty one acres and a Quarter lying in the 30 Rod wide Highway (so called) and Order the Plan of ^{Sd} land to be Recorded -

10th To See if the Town will Discontinue so much of the Old Road which did lead from Amos Smiths to Concord Road as now lyeth in Jonas Balcoms and W^m Skinners field and Except of the other Road as it is laid out by the Selectmen and Grant ^{Sd} Old Road to W^m Skinner for Satisfaction for the new one

11th To See if the Town will Order the Town Treasurer to Give A Joseph Willis Credit on his Bond for Six pound Thirteen Shillings and four pence which he paid to Philip Rayley for his house provided ^{Sd} Willis will Deliver the Deed he Received of the ^{Sd} Philip to the Town -

12th To See if the Town will Discontinue so much of the Old Road about forty Rod west of Phineas Gleasons House as to make ^{Sd} Gleason Field Fence straight and Except of the other Road Adjoining to it as laid out by the Selectmen, ^{Sd} Gleason Making the new Road passable for carting
