

X Then the Town by their vote Adjourned their meeting to Friday the twenty fifth Day of March 1791 At one o'clock Afternoon on Friday to meet at the same place - - - - -

The Town being met according to the aforesd Adjournment Proceeded to finish what remained to be Done - - - - -

4th this Article was put to vote and passed in the Negative -

5th The Town by their vote Discontinued the Old Road leading through Capt David Baldwins Land Near the Old Town Bridge to Sedge Meadow so called) and also Excepted of the other Road as it was laid out by the Select Men provided to Baldwin a sufficient Stone wall so far as the water is Deep to prevent Cattle Running into the water - - - - -

6th The Town by their vote Discontinued the Old Road leading East from Concord Road (near Josiah Farrar's House) to Lincoln Bound and also accepted of the other Road as it was laid out by the Select Men &c - - - - -

7th The Town voted to Build a work House also by their vote Ordered that a House should be Built on the Towns Land where Josiah Pratt formerly lived and Chose a Committee viz Capt David Baldwin May^r Josiah Richardson & En. Jabez Puffer afterward the Town by their vote reconsidered the above vote and also voted to Hire a suitable House for a work House the present year and at the same time Hired a House and Garden plot of Mr. Isaac Read for the sum of Forty Shillings and the Town by their vote Chose Overseers of the Poor and a House for the present year who are to serve gratis viz En. Jabez Puffer Mr. John Maynard Capt Josiah Richardson Mr. Isaac Read Mr. Jonathan Carter May^r Joseph Curtis Mr. Ezra Graves Mr. John Tillon Mr. Joseph Livermore

8th The Town by their vote Excepted of St. Joseph Willis Man of three Acre and forty four Rod and gave leave the same may be Recorded

9th The Town by their vote Dismissed the Ninth Article - - - - -

10th The Town by their vote Discontinued the Old Road mentioned in this Article and Excepted of the new one as it was laid out by the Select men and gave said Old Road to Mr. Wm. Skinner for Satisfaction for the new one -

11th The Town by their vote Ordered the Town Treasurer Mr. Tho^s. Nymton to give St. Joseph Willis Credit on his Bond for six Pound thirteen Shillings and four pence which St. Joseph Willis paid Philip Rayley for his house - - - - -

12th The Town by their vote Accepted of the Alteration made in the Road
35 mentioned in this Article - - - - -

13th The Town by their vote Accepted of the Road laid out for the Benefit of Mr. Asker Cutter and Ordered the same to be Recorded

14th the fourteenth Article was put to vote and passed in the Negative

15th The fifteenth Article was put to vote and passed in the Negative

16th The sixteenth Article was Dismissed
