

And Order their Present Town Treasurer to pay out such Sum or Sums of money by Order of the Overseers of the Poore in sd Town as shall be Necessary - - - - -

5th And also to see if the Town will Except of the Rules Broom and by Laws made and voted by the Overseers of the Poore in said Town to Govern and Regulate the sd work House and confirm the same - - - - -

6th To see if the Town will Choose a Constable in the Room of Mr. Tho. Bent in Case he refuse to serve - - - - -

7th To see if the Town will accept of Capt Israel Moore Man of One acre and fifty Rods of Land in the thirty Rod wide High way (so called) and Order the same to be Recorded.

and Make Due Return of this Order with your Doings thereon to the Town Clerk at Least two Days before the aforesaid Meeting,

In Observance of the within Order I have warned all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants Qualified to vote in Town Affairs and in the Choice of Representatives (in my ward) to meet at time and place within mentioned

Sudbury 14th May. 1763 Josiah Farrar one of the Constables for Sudbury

The Return of the Other three Constables Orders were as the Law Directs and were Excepted by the Town

At a Meeting of the Town of Sudbury leaguallly warned May 16th 1763 The Town being met at time and place proceeded and Chose for their Representation for the ensuing year Col^o John Noyes a Freeholder and Resident in sd Town

At the said Meeting May 16th the Town proceeded and Chose Col^o John Noyes Moderator

2³⁶ article was put and passed in the Affirmative
