 meet at the west Meeting House in Sudbury on Sunday the
 Fifth Day of March Next at Ten o' Clock before noone
 then and there - -

- 1st To Choose Selectmen Town Clerk Town Treasurer Assessor
 Constables and all other Town Officers which the Law Directs
 to be annually Chosen in the month of March
- 2^d To see if the Town by their vote will give Liberty for
 Horses to go at large (without fitters) any part of the time
 from the first of April to the Last of November the
 year ensuing
- 3^d To see if the Town will Repair their Highway by a
 Rate the present year and Grant a suitable sum of Money
 for repairing the same and Impower the Surveyor
 to be Collector also Order the Assessor to make it into
 a Rate forthwith
- 4th To see if the Town by their vote will give Liberty for
 the Sheep to go at Large in D Town any part of the
 time from the fifteenth Day of March Next to the first
 Day of May Next.
- 5th To see if the Town will accept of the Highway as laid out
 by the Selectmen Begining att Mr Lemuel Govers to
 Framingham Line as may appear by the Minutes
 the Selectmen took of D way
