

6. To See if the Town by their vote will Give Liberty to Joseph Curtis and Others to Hang a Gate a Cross the Road Leading to those Pond so called Agreeable to their Request During the Towns Pleasure

7. To See if the Town by their vote will Allow to the Heirs of Benj. Wright One Pound Ten Shillings Out of the unappropriated Money for Land Taken from them for a Highway

And make return of this Order with your Doings thereon to the Town Clerk at time and place within Mentioned

By Order of the Select Men

Sudbury 4th May. 1764

In Obediance to this Order I have warned and Caused to be warned the Freeholders and Other Inhabitants in my ward Quallified as the Law Directs to Meet at time and place within Directed

Sudbury May 14 1764

John Maynard One of the Constables for Sudbury

The Returns of the other Three Constables was for the Law Directs and was Excepted by the Town

All a Town Meeting in Sudbury Legally warned May 14th 1764

1. The Town being Meet all time and place Proceeded and Chose Col. John Noyes a Freeholder and Resident in the Town to Represent them in a Great and Gen. Court the Ensuing year
Then the Town proceeded and Chose Col. John Noyes Moderator

2. The Town by their vote Gave Liberty of the Swine in the Town Should go at Large the present year

3. This article was put to vote and passed in the Affirmative

4. Granted to Ezra Graves for Land taken from him for a Highway Eighteen Shillings 0 18 0
Also the Town by their vote Ordered the Select Men to Go and view the Land taken from Amos Sanderson and make report to the Town at their next Town meeting

5. Arti was put to vote and passed in the Negative

6. The Town by their vote Gave Maj. Joseph Curtis Liberty to hang a Gate a Cross the Road Agreeable to his petition

7. The Town voted to appropriate the Sum of one pound Ten Shillings out of the new Grant Bonds to pay the Heirs of Benj Wright for Land Taken from them for a Highway
