These Order you to warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants off and belonging to Sudbury (in your ward) Qualified as the Law Directs to Vote in Town Affairs to Meet at the East Meetinghouse in Sudbury on Monday the fourth Day of March next at Ten O'Clock before Noon then and there

1st To Chuse Select Men Town Clerk Town Treasurer Assessors Constables and all other Town officers which the Law Directs to be Annually Chosen in the Month of March

2^d To see if the Town by their Vote will Give Liberty for Horses to go at Large without fillers any part of the time from the first of April to the last of November the year ensuing

3^d To see if the Town will Repair their Highways by a Rate the Present year and Grant a suitable Sum of Money for repairing the same and Impower the Surveyors to be Collectors of said Rate also Order the Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith

4th To see if the Town by their Vote will Give Liberty for the sheep to go at Large in sd Town any part of the time from the fivteenth Day of March next to the first Day of May next

5th To see if the Town by their Vote will Give Liberty for the same to go at Large in sd Town the year ensuing

6th To see if the Town will Except of a Highway from Acton Lane to a Road Leading from Mr Amos Smiths to Abijah Brigham as laid Out by the Select Men agreeable to a Petition of Henry Smith and Others

7th To see if the Town will appropriate a sum of money Out of the New Grant bond to purchase or Hire a work House and Provide Materials proper for the same or Do or act as the Town shall think proper when meet

8th To see if the Town by their Vote will Consent that the Old School House Near the East Meetinghouse in Sudbury should be improved towards Rebuilding Near sd Meeting House

9th To see if the Town will Choose Collectors and pay them for the future for Collecting the Publick Taxes and also to see if the Town will pay the Constables for Collecting Publick Taxes for the year past agreeable to a petition of John Merriam & Others
