

2. To See if the Town by their Vote will Give Liberty for the Horses to Go at Large (with out Letters) any part of the Time from the first of April to the Last of Nov^r the year ensuing
 3. To See if the Town will Repair three Highways by a Rate the present year. & Grant a Sutable Sum of Money for Repairing the same & Impower the Surveyors to be Collectors of said Rate: Also Order the Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith
 - 4th To See if the Town by their Vote will Give Liberty for the Sheep to Go at Large in said Town any part of Time from the fifteenth Day of March Next to the first Day of May Next
 - 5th To See if the Town will Give Liberty for the Swine to Go at Large in said Town the year ensuing
 - 6th To if the Town by their Vote will Accept of Eben^r Roby Esq^r plan of fourteen Acres & half of Land sold to him by said Town in the New Grant 30 Rod wide Highway so Called & order the said plan to be Recorded said Land Being reserved & formally Recorded
 - 7th To See if the Town will Accept of the List of Jurors as put into the Box by the Selectmen
 - 8th To See if the Town by their Vote will Hire or Build a workhouse the present year
 - 9th To See if the Town by their Vote will Accept of a Highway as laid out by the Selectmen at the Request of Dea^r Josiah Haynes and Lic^t Elisha Whulor as may appear by the Minutes of the Selectmen of said way & order the same to be Recorded
