  - 7<sup>th</sup> the seventh article put to vote & the Town by their vote Accepted of the List of Jurors  
as put into the Box by the Selectmen
  - 8<sup>th</sup> the eighth article put to vote & the Town By their vote voted to hire a work House  
the present year: & agree: with m<sup>r</sup> Isaac Read for the same House they  
Hired the last year & to Give him the Sum of £. 800 for the same
  - 9<sup>th</sup> this article was Dismissed

& General Court or Assembly appointed to be Conven: held & kept for  
his Majesties service at the Court house in Boston on Wednesday the  
Twenty seventh Day of May Currant at Nine o'Clock A.M. & so to be die  
in diem During their Session or Sessions as Directed in said Precept sent to  
said Town

2. To See if the Town will Appropriates a Suitable Sum of money out  
of the New Grant Bonds or ~~subsidies~~ to provide Suitable Articles to furnish  
the work House for supplying & employing the poor in said Town the present  
year: & Defraying the Nupbary Charges arising in the Cause of William Dunn

3. To See if the Town By their vote will order the Collectors of the High  
way Rate. to allow the persons that work at the Highways 3<sup>d</sup> per Day for a  
man & 1/6 for a yoke of Oxen & 1/6 for a Cart Till the first of Sept<sup>r</sup> Next

4<sup>th</sup> To See if the Town will proceed any farther in the Cause of W<sup>m</sup> Dunn

5<sup>th</sup> To See if the Town will Except the Selectmens Settlement with  
the Treasurer m<sup>r</sup> Tho: Plympton
