

at a Town Meeting in Sudbury Legally Warned Dec^r 21st 1767
The Town Being met at Time & place proceeded & took into Consideration a Motion made by the Gent^l Selectmen of the Chief Town of this Province, for encouragement of Industry Economy & Manufactures within the same. Unanimously voted a Cheerfull concurrence with the Votes of the Town of Boston at their meeting on the 28th of Oct^r 1767, also Unanimously voted Not to purchase any of the Enamiated Articles, also Unanimously voted to use there the most Endeavors to promote Industry Economy & Manufactures among them

- 2^d The Town by their Vote appropriated Ten Dollars of the money due on the New Grant Bonds to pay the Charge of a presentment against said Town & to pay other Charges that may occasionally arise in said Town 30
- Then the Town by their Vote Dissolved said Meeting

These Order you to warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants off and Belonging to Sudbury in your ward Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs as the Law Directs to Meet at the vest Meeting House in Sudbury the Seventh Day of March Next at Ten O^{clock} in the forenoon on said Day then and their

- 1st To Choose Selectmen Town Clerk Town Treasurer Assessors Constables and all Other Town Officers as the Law Directs Annually to be Chosen in the Month of March
- 2^d To See if the Town will Give Liberty for Horses to go at Large without Fellers any Part of the Time from the first of April to the Last of November the year ensuing
- 3^d To See if the Town will Repair their Highways by a Rate the present year and Grant a suitable sum of money for repairing the same and Impower the Surveyors to be Collectors of sd Rate also Order the Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith by their vote 59.1
- 4th To See if the Town will Give Liberty for the Sheep to go at Large in said Town any part of the Time from the fifteenth Day of March Next to the first Day of May next
