7th To see if the Town will appropriate a sum of money out of the New Grant Bond for the Relief of the poor the present year

And Make Due Return of this Order with your Doings thereon to the select men or Town Clerk at Time & place

In Observance of this Order I have warned all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants in my ward Qualified as the Law Directs to vote in Town Affairs to meet at Time and place as within Directed

The Returns of the other three Constables were as the Law Directs & were Excepted by said Town

At a Town Meeting in Dudbury Legally warned May 9th 1768

The Town being met at Time and place Proceeded as followeth

1st The Town by their vote Chose John Noyes Esq.^r a Freeholder and Resident in said Town to ~~be~~ be their Representatives the ensuing year

2^d The Town by their vote Chose John Noyes Esq.^r their Moderator

3^d This Article was put to vote and the Town by their vote Left it to the select men to say where the school should be kept

4th The Town by their vote Excepted Lev^t Joseph Willis to serve Constable in the room of Mr. Thomas Carr

5th It was put to vote to know if it was the mind of the Town that the several Courts and Offices for the future should be kept at Concord agreeable to a Petition ^{signed by Agents} and past in the Affirmative

6th This Article was put to vote and past in the Negative

7th This Article was put to vote and past in the Negative

8th The Town by their vote appropriated the sum of Twenty Pounds out of the New Grant Bond in their Town Treasurers hand for the Relief of the poor
