Directs to vote in Town Affairs to Meet at the East Meeting House
in Sudbury on Thinsday the Twenty second of September Instant
at Two o'Clock in the afternoon on said Day then & there

To see if the Town will Comply with the request of the
Selectmen of Boston to make Choice of a suitable person
or persons to act in Convention with such as may be
sent from the several Towns of this Province in Order
to Consult and Advise to such Measures as may be for the
Benefit of his Majesties Service and the peace and safety
of his Majesties Subjects

and Make Due Return of this Order and your Doings thereon
to the Selectmen or Town Clerk at Time and place
Sudbury Sept. 19th 1768

The Returns of the other Three Constables were as the
Law Directs and were accepted by the Town.

At a Town Meeting in Sudbury Legally warned Sept. 22th 1768
The Town being meet at Time and place provided and Chose
John Noyes Esq. their Moderator

Then the Town by their vote Chose Mr. Thomas Minton to
act for them in a Convention at Boston in Order that such
Measures may be Consulted and Advised as his Majesties Service and
the peace and safety of his Subjects in the province may require
