Inhabitants off and Belonging to Sudbury (in your
ward) Quallified as the Law Directs to Vote in Town Affairs
and in the Choice of Representation, to meet at the west
Meetinghouse in Sudbury On Monday the Twenty second
Day of May Currant at One O'Clock in the afternone
then and there

1st To Elect and Depute One or more Person or Persons being
Freeholders and Residents in said Town to Serve for and Represent
said Town at a Great and General Court or Assembly Appointed
to be Convened, Held and kept for His Majesties Service at the
Court House in Boston On Wednesday the thirly first Day of
May Currant at Nine O'Clock A.M. and so de die in diem
During their Session or Sessions as Directed in said Precept sent
to said Town

2nd To see if the Town will Build a workhouse in said Town
and Order where said workhouse shall be set and Grant a
suitable Sum of money to Build the same or Do or Act
Any Other way as the Town shall think Proper when
met.

3rd To see if the Town will Grant or Appropriates a suitable
Sum of money to Repair the windows in Each of the
Meetinghouses in said Town or Do or Act any other way as
the Town shall think proper when met

and make Due Return of this Order with your Doing thereon
at Time and Place
