

These are to Notifie and warn the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury to Meet at the west Mellinghouse in Sudbury on Monday the Ninetenth Day of March Currant at Four O'Clock in the Afternoone then and there to Take Under Consideration the following Articles Viz -

- 1st To see if the Town by their Vote will Manifest their hearty and unanimous Approbation of the Generous Agreement of merchants in Boston to put a stop to the Importation of British Goods and Engage for themselves and all within their Influence and by all proper Methods that they will Countenance and Encourage the same
- 2^d To see if the Town will by their Vote Discountenance the Importers Advertizing in the Public Prints who Presume to Counteract the Patriotick Scheme of the Body of merchants in Boston and throughout North America by withdrawing all Commercial Connection from them and their Abettors and by frowning upon those that shall presume to hold any Commerce ~~with~~ or Correspondance with them.
- 3^d To see if the Town will Encourage the Nailing Buissness and all other Necessary American Manufactures and Abstain from the Luxuries and Superfluities of the Indies which has ben so Improverishing to this Country Especially the Renowned Plant Tea untill a General Importation Takes place
and Do or Act any Other way as the Town shall think proper when met
