

* At a Town Meeting in Sudbury Legally warned March 19th 1770
The Town being met at Time and Place proceeded and Chose Mr. Thomas
Plympton Moderator then the Town proceeded as followeth ~~and~~ Came into
the following Votes or Resolutions viz.

- 1st The Town by their vote manifested their hearty and Unanimous
Approbation of the Generous Agreement of Merchants in Boston to
put a Stop to the Importation of British Goods and Engage for themselves
and all within their Influence and by all proper Method, that they will
Countenance and Encourage the Same
 - 2^d The Town Voted that they would Discountenance the Importers Adventiz
in the Publick Prints (who Presume to Counteract the Patriotic Scheme
of the Body of Merchants in Boston and throughout North America)
by withdrawing all Commercial Connection from them and their Abettors
and by frowning upon those that shall presume to had any Commerce
or Correspondence with them
 - 3^d Voted that they would Encourage the Raising Business and all other
Necessary American Manufactures and Abstain from the Luxury &
~~Superfluity~~ of the Foreign which has ben so impoverishing to this Contry Especially
the Renowned Plant Tea until a General Importation takes Place
 - 4th Voted that if any of the Town Contrary to the True Intent & spirit
of this Agreement should had any Commerce with the Importers
within our knowledge we will Publickly expose them
 - 5th Voted that the Town Clerk Transmit a Copy of these Votes to the
Committee of Merchants of Inspection in the Town of Boston
