Law Directs to Vote in Town Affairs and in the Choice of  
Representatives, to Meet at the East Meeting House in Sudbury  
on Monday the Twenty first of May Current at Two O'Clock  
in the afternoon then & there

1<sup>st</sup> To Elect and Depute One or more Persons being Freeholders  
and Residents in said Town to serve for and Represent said Town  
at a Great and General Court or Assembly appointed to be Conven.  
Held and kept for his Majesties Service at Harvard College in  
Cambridge on Wednesday the Thirtieth Day of May Current at nine  
O'Clock in the Forenoon and so De Die in Diem During their  
Session or Sessions as is Directed in said Precept sent to said Town

2<sup>d</sup> To see if the Town will Grant and Confirm to Lev. Joseph Willis  
about Three Acres of Land he Bought of the Town Com<sup>rs</sup> agreeable  
to the Plan of the same and Order the said Plan to be Recorded  
or Do or Act any other way as the Town shall think proper  
when Met

3<sup>d</sup> To see if the Town will by their Vote Curb the Highway ~~Settly~~  
Laid out by the Selectmen and Accepted by the Town at the head of  
the Great Meadow through Micah Goodenows Land agreeable to a  
Petition of Lev. Daniel Goodenow & others

4<sup>th</sup> To see if the Town will Order by their Vote that Three of the  
Overseers shall be a Majority Provided but Five met & act the  
Present year

5<sup>th</sup> To see if the Town will Choose a Committee to Prosecute to final  
Judgment Mr. Asher Cutter for the Support of Cap<sup>t</sup>. John Hayses & his  
wife and appropriate a suitable Sum of money for that Purpose or  
Do or Act any other way as the Town shall think proper when met

6<sup>th</sup> To see if the Town will Choose a Constable for the Northwest ward  
in the Room of Mr. James Mosman who was freed from serving in that  
Office by the Sessions in March Last

7<sup>th</sup> To see if the Town will appropriate a sufficient sum of money for the  
Support of the poore in said Town the Present year
